READ (5 mins)

Take the time and read Nehemiah 12:27–47 together in your own bibles.

RELATE (30 mins)

(Relate to what was shared and on key themes in the sermon)

- 1. In the bible passage above we see God’s people coming together to worship as they dedicate the walls of Jerusalem. If we were all called to gather at the SportsHub at Kallang or even at a city in another country in order to dedicate ourselves to God as one people of God would you go?**
- 2. Many names are recorded in the scripture passage. What can we learn from this long recording of so many names? Feel free to share your thoughts.**

REFLECT (30 mins)

(Reflect and apply God’s word to our daily lives)

- 1. The two choirs sang so loud that people from far away heard their singing. Do you look forward to singing in a worship service? How do you feel about singing loudly during service?**
- 2. Before the dedication of the walls, the people needed to be purified. Why was this important? Is this important for us to have a pure heart when we come together for worship, whether at the Sunday service or at life group meeting? How do we purify ourselves for worship?**

3. **One important demonstration of our worship of God is in providing for God's servants. What were the reasons God's people gave as can be seen in the Bible? Why should we to give to the church today?**
