Thankfulness & God

1. It acknowledges the grace of God at work in our lives and signifies our trust in God.

"In the days of Ahaz the son of Jotham, son of Uzziah, king of Judah, Rezin the king of Syria and Pekah the son of Remaliah the king of Israel came up to Jerusalem to wage war against it, but could not yet mount an attack against it.

When the house of David was told, "Syria is in league with Ephraim," the heart of Ahaz and the heart of his people shook as the trees of the forest shake before the wind." (Isaiah 7:1-2)

Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz, "Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven." (7:10-11)

Offer from the Lord that Ahaz might respond in faith

But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test." And he said, "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? (7:12-13)

Ahaz's refusal to trust God

Sign from the Lord

"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." (7:14)

"All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us)." (Matthew in 1:23)

The sign summons us to believe in the God who is with us.

 When we leave God out of the equation of our lives and planning because of fear, we are likely to find ourselves in a far worse fear.

Thankfulness & Self 2. Frees us from pride and envy.

- Proud people do not say thanks.
- Sense of entitlement

- Thankfulness works against pride because it is grounded in the truth that we need others.
- We are not self-sufficient.

- Thankfulness is the door to happiness.
- When you are thankful for what you have, you are not consumed with wanting something different or something more.
