THE HEART OF PRAYER

- Intimate fellowship with God
- God is the initiator of prayer
- Listening and responding in love
- Context: Our human frailty

THE SUBSTANCE OF PRAYER: FAITH

"Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours."

- Whatever seems humanly impossible is made possible through praying in faith
- Faith is trusting in Jesus and persevering in the midst of doubt
- Faith is <u>really believing</u> what God says in His Word and this often involves action and risk-taking.

THE LOGIC OF PRAYER

Our prayers make a <u>real</u> difference.
"You do not have because you do not ask"

If things were going to happen anyway, what would be the purpose of prayer? God has apparently given Himself a self-imposed restriction – to act in the affairs of man in response to prayer.

PRAY for PERSEVERANCE

Will God give us everything we pray for when we persist in our prayers?



LUKE 11:2-4

2 So He said to them, When you pray, say: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven. 3 Give us day by day our daily bread. 4 And forgive us our sins, For we also forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the evil one.

NEVER GIVE UP

The most difficult prayer, and the prayer which, therefore costS us the most striving, is persevering prayer, the prayer which faints not, but continues steadfastly until the answers come.

To strive in prayer for a person or for a cause means in the first place, to live, feel and suffer with that person or that cause. That alone requires a great struggle especially if we are not related to the person concerned by blood or friendship.

NEVER GIVE UP

In the second place, to strive in prayer means to struggle through those hindrances that would restrain or even prevent us entirely from continuing in persevering prayer. It means to be watchful at all times that we can notice that we become slothful in prayer and go to the Spirit of prayer to have this remedied. In this struggle too, the decisive factor is the Spirit of prayer. (O Hallesby, "Prayer")
