

The Past Will Haunt Us Unless...

WE RECOVER

1. Calibrating the past candidly with wise perspectives

Father died: Brothers & Joseph had different perspectives.

Brothers were fearful.

Unwise company will reinforce our perspectivea negatively.

2. Coming to terms with our negative emotions associated with past.

Brothers were plagued with guilt, fear & bitter about past.

Very easy and most natural to be engrossed in negative emotions.

3. By centering our lives in God

Potiphar: He saw God in the temptation.

3. By centering our lives in God

Whether in prison or palace, God was with Him because Joseph recognized the presence of God.

When we recognized God's presence, others will see God's presence in you.

3. By centering our lives in God

Gen 39: "The Lord was with Joseph" Obvious to pagan, people outside the Kingdom.

V 21 – Prison warden show kindness

V 23 Potiphar raised him up to responsible position

4. By aligning our purposes to God's purpose

Recognizing that all that happened to us (good, bad & ugly) is not about you but for God's purpose - the saving of many lives.

Pyramid: Joseph's eyes were not on the pyramid. His eyes were on God. God is not the means but his terminal point.

The essence of triumph is that God's purposes are served not that we will be rewarded.

True test of finding value in the past is when we can give assurance and act kindly.

We are willing to love despite the risks of being bitten & rejected again.
