Legacy of Promise Matthew 1:1-17



1 The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the <u>son of David</u>, the <u>son of Abraham</u>.

2 To Abraham was born Isaac; and to Isaac, Jacob; and to Jacob, Judah and his brothers;

3 and to Judah were born Perez and Zerah by **Tamar**; and to Perez was born Hezron; and to Hezron, Ram;

4 and to Ram was born Amminadab; and to Amminadab, Nahshon; and to Nahshon, Salmon;



5 and to Salmon was born Boaz by Rahab; and to Boaz was born Obed by Ruth; and to Obed, Jesse;

6 and to Jesse was born **David the king**. And to **David** was born Solomon by her who had been the **wife of Uriah**;

7 and to Solomon was born Rehoboam; and to Rehoboam, Abijah; and to Abijah, Asa;

8 and to Asa was born Jehoshaphat; and to Jehoshaphat, Joram; and to Joram, Uzziah;



9 and to Uzziah was born Jotham; and to Jotham, Ahaz; and to Ahaz, Hezekiah;

10 and to Hezekiah was born Manasseh; and to Manasseh, Amon; and to Amon, Josiah;

11 and to Josiah were born Jeconiah and his brothers, at the time of the deportation to Babylon.

12 And after the deportation to Babylon, to Jeconiah was born Shealtiel; and to Shealtiel, Zerubbabel;



13 and to Zerubbabel was born Abihud; and to Abihud, Eliakim; and to Eliakim, Azor;

14 and to Azor was born Zadok; and to Zadok, Achim; and to Achim, Eliud;

- 15 and to Eliud was born Eleazar; and to Eleazar, Matthan; and to Matthan, Jacob;
- 16 and to Jacob was born Joseph **the husband of Mary**, by whom was born Jesus, who is called Christ.

17 Therefore all the generations from Abraham to David are fourteen generations; and from David to the deportation to Babylon fourteen generations; and from the deportation to Babylon to the time of Christ fourteen generations.

Promise fulfilment

2 Samuel 7:12-16 12 "When your days are complete and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your descendant after you, who will come forth from you, and I will establish his kingdom. 13 "He shall build a house for My name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever.

14 "I will be a father to him and he will be a son to Me; when he commits iniquity, I will correct him with the rod of men and the strokes of the sons of men, 15 but My lovingkindness shall not depart from him, as I took it away from Saul, whom I removed from before you. 16 "And your house and your kingdom shall endure before Me forever; your throne shall be established forever."



Genesis 22:16-18 "...By Myself I have sworn, declares the LORD, because you have done this thing, and have not withheld your son, your only son (Issac), indeed I will greatly bless you, and I will greatly multiply your seed as the stars of the heavens, and as the sand which is on the seashore; and your seed shall possess the gate of their enemies. 18 "And in your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice." 
#Promise Keeper

Yes! God is Promise-Keeper!

• But....The problem?

 We might not be sure which promises in the Bible are for us; which are not.

 We might wonder when is He going to keep His promise or even felt disappointed <u>by the way</u> He keeps His promises.

Three guidelines for reading God's Promises

Know the context of which God's promises are made.

Differentiate between a promise and a principle.

 Take note of promises with conditional clauses.

Unambiguous Promises

- He promises to provide a way out of temptation (1 Cor. 10:13).
- He promises that our salvation is secure, no matter what (John 10:28–29).
- He promises to never leave us nor forsake us (Heb. 13:5).
- He promises to finish the good work he has begun in us (Phil. 1:6).
- He promises to come back (Luke 12:40)



 When we talk about the promises of God, we are encouraged through the Bible to focus on WHO God is, rather than WHAT God can do for us.



Jesus came from those He came for.
