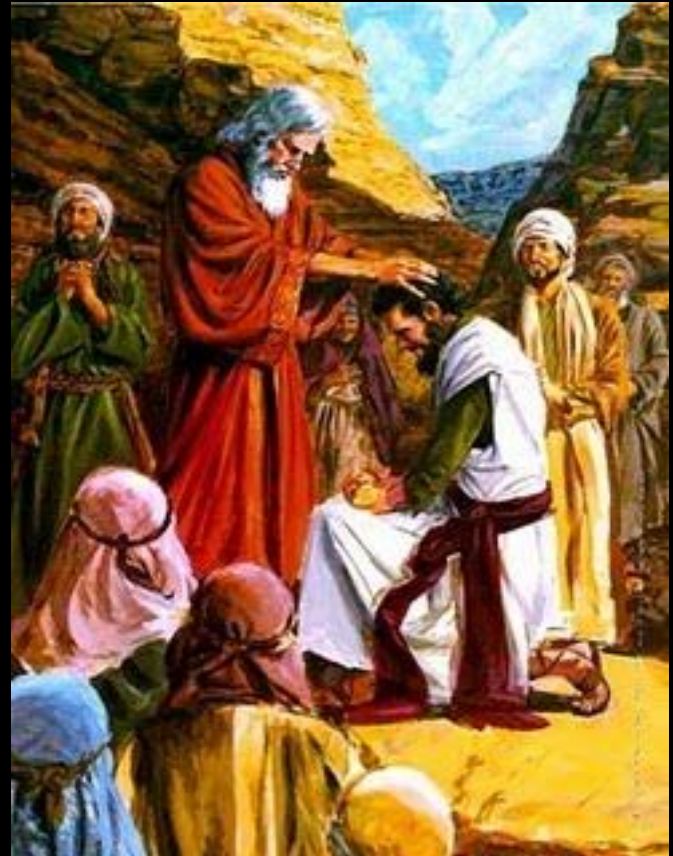

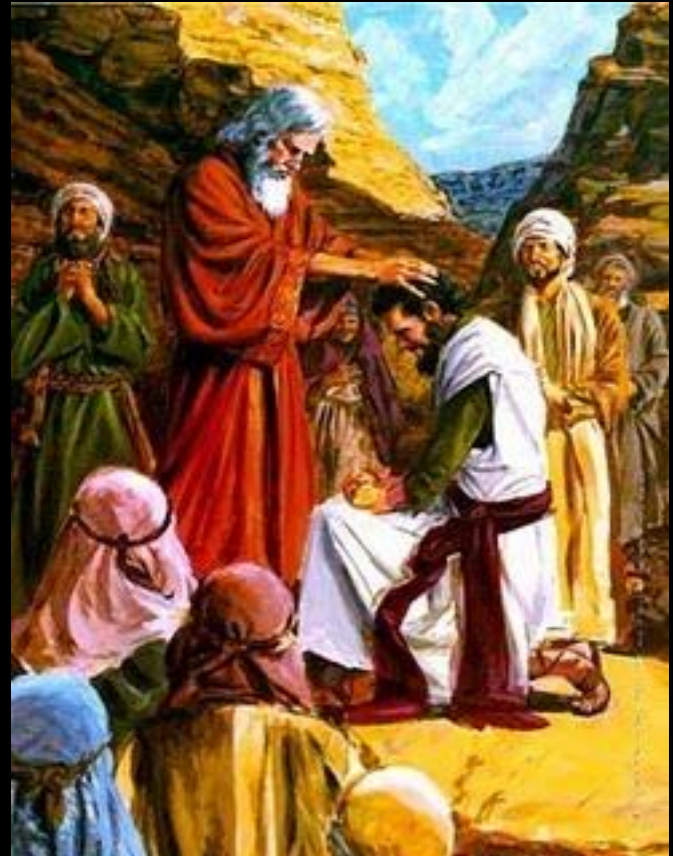
## Num 27 : 18 - 20

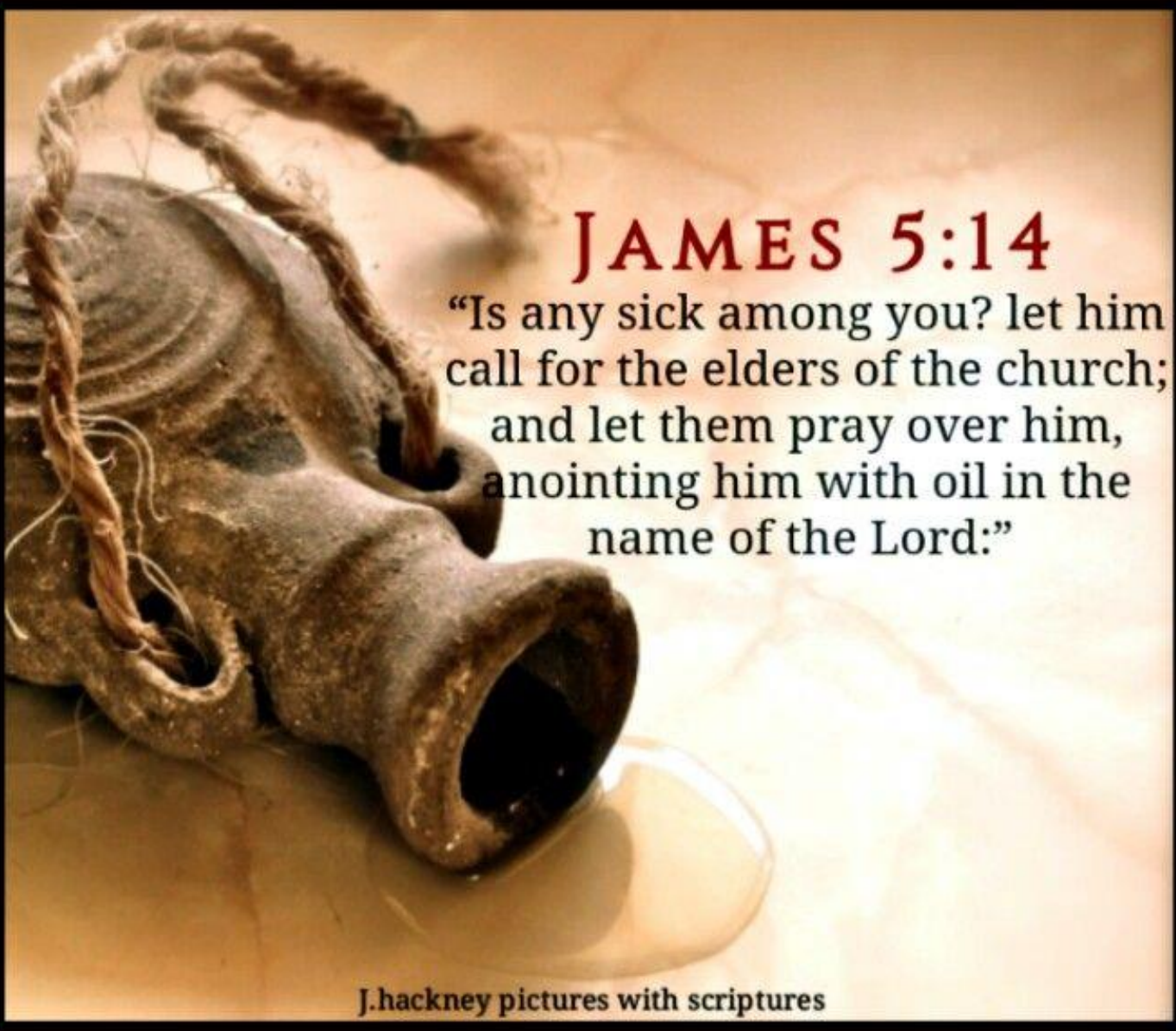
<sup>16</sup> For as yet He had fallen upon none of them. They had only been baptized in the name of the Lord

- What if I am still not healed?

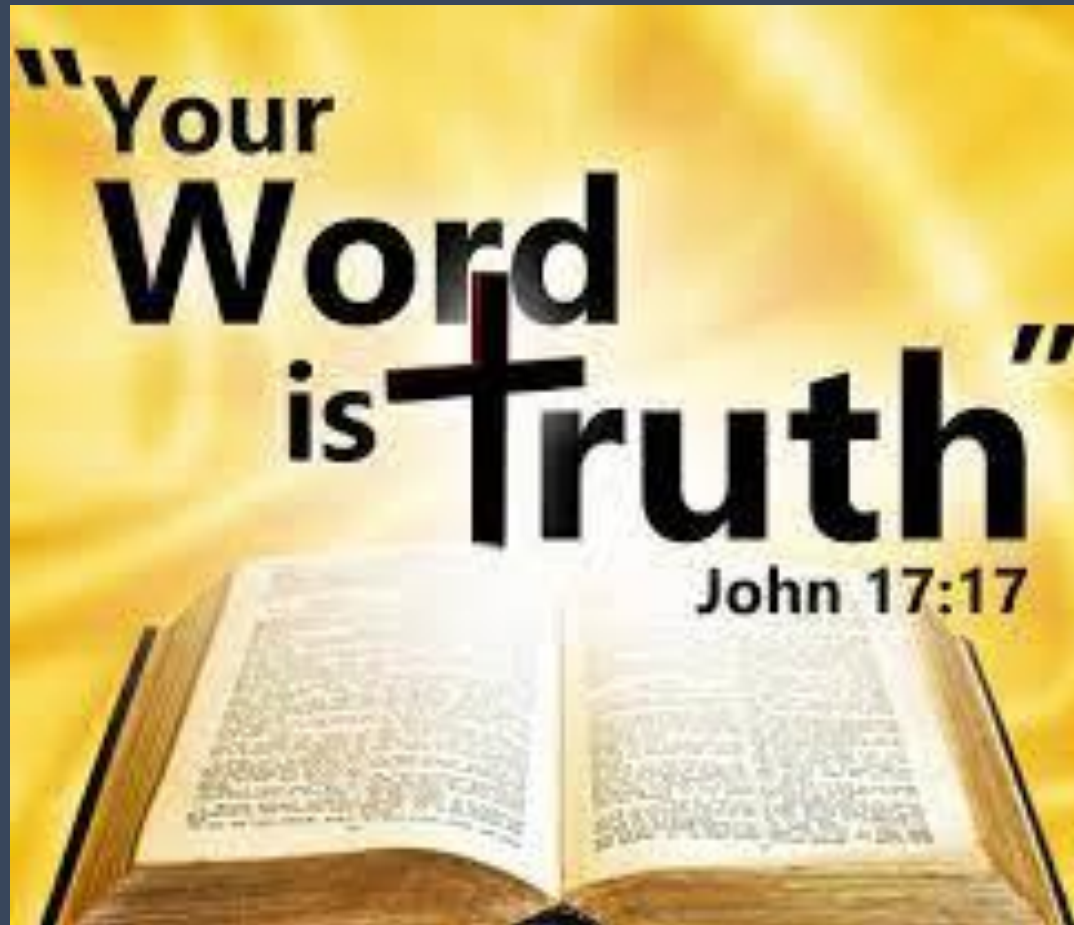


...Therefore David said to his servants, “Is the child dead?”

<sup>20</sup> So David arose from the ground, washed and anointed himself, and changed his clothes; and he went into the house of the Lord and worshiped.



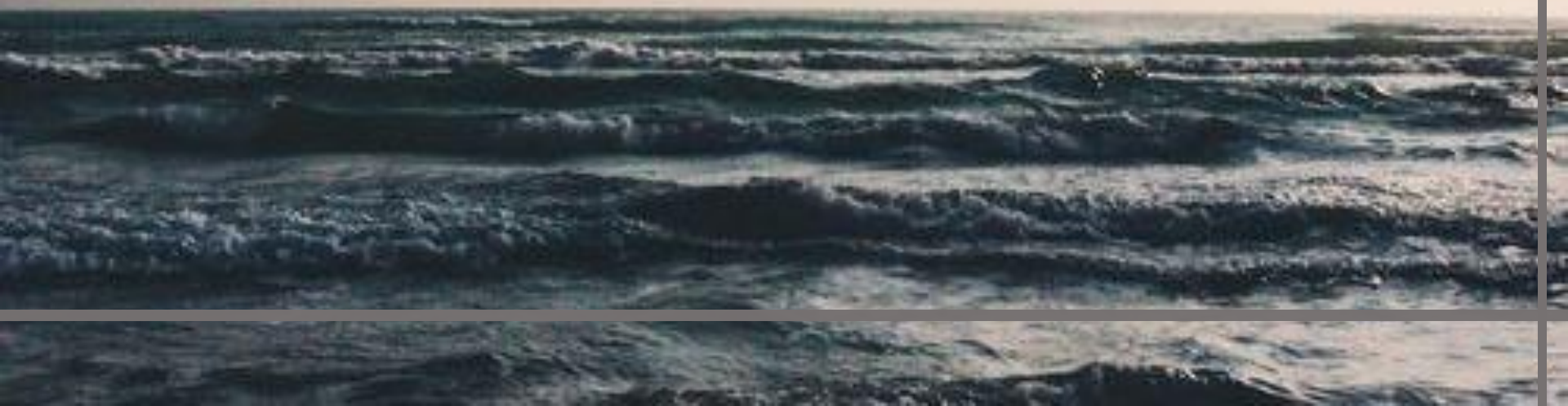
